Academic Summer School Attendance

All parents and students must read and understand the following participation policies. They are strictly enforced. No exceptions will be made.

The following policy applies to all summer school students:

- a. Students are expected to be in the classroom when the period begins.
- b. A student can earn up to two (2) participation points for a course per day.
- c. Any tardiness or missed class time in excess of fifteen (15) minutes will be counted as one (1) absence.
- d. Any unexcused absence will cause a loss of two (2) participation points.
- e. The secondary summer school administrator will make every effort to notify parents/guardians after each absence or missed class time in excess of fifteen (15) minutes.
- f. A student's home school will be notified of dismissals and withdrawals.
- g. Students who have lost six (6) participation points will not earn a course grade.

Summer School Regulations

Smoking - Not allowed in the school building or on school property

Food/Drinks - Designated areas only

Parking - Designated areas only

Remember that each class session is equivalent to one week's work in the regular academic year. Even one tardy can cause you to fall seriously behind in the course. In order to ensure your success in this program, you should make every effort to be on time and attend every class session.

Ulster BOCES is pleased to be working with the Highland, Kingston, New Paltz, Onteora, and Saugerties districts to design a 9-12 grade academic summer school.

Summer School Frequently Asked Questions

Who May Attend the Academic High School?

Only district residents of Highland, Kingston, New Paltz, Onteora and Saugerties may enroll. The courses are designed for students who have completed the requirements for the course (**including science labs**) and now need a passing grade in either the course or the Regents examination. This is an academic summer school program.

What is meant by “completed the requirements?”

The amount of time spent in each course in summer school is only enough to earn a credit if the student has already taken the course and completed any necessary lab requirements.

Are there any exceptions?

There are no exceptions for the Summer School Program.

How do I register for courses?

Students must complete registration with their home school guidance counselor on one of the following dates:

Resident student tuition is paid by the student’s district.

How do I register for a Regents only?

Registration is due at the home school guidance office and must be completed by Wednesday, June 27. Academic Summer School will send a letter to students on July 30 informing them of exam day/time.*

Students MUST present a picture ID to sit for Regents exams.

How do I know about Summer School Regulations & Student Discipline Policy?

A copy of the Regulations and Policies are part of the registration packet. Students and their parents/guardians are to sign the registration form indicating they have read and understood the regulations and policies as part of the registration process.

When can I be on Academic Summer School Property?

You may be in the building or on the grounds of the school site you are attending only during the time period for which you are enrolled.

Schedule

June 22 - June 27 - Student Registration (see schedule of times and locations on previous page) takes place in the home school Guidance Office.

Forms are due no later than Wednesday June 27, 2018.

July 9 - Classes begin (Classes are in session Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday)

July 24 - High School Reports mailed home.

July 30 - Letters mailed home to Regents exam registrants.

August 14 - Last day of classes.

Regents exams: Thursday, Aug. 16, Friday, Aug. 17

Students will be notified of classes not being held by noon, Tuesday, July 3.

If you do not hear from the summer school office by 4:00 Thursday, July 5, your registration has been confirmed and you are to report to class on Monday, July 9, 2018.
